

Communication Disorders Technician (CDT) Program

Nova Scotia Hearing and Speech Centres (NSHSC) and the Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) have partnered to create a custom program to train Communication Disorders Technicians in order to meet NSHSC's need for supportive personnel. Three such programs have been offered to date.

Communication Disorders Technicians assist Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists in their work with newborns, young children, adults and their families. Technicians bring knowledge of hearing, speech and language disorders to assist with the screening, diagnosis and treatment, and use of assistive/rehabilitative communication devices.
